CLASSROOM BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

Classroom Expectations	Expected Student Behaviors
R ESPECT	
T ime	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Arrive prepared with all materials.2. Stay on task.3. Be ready to start class when the bell rings.4. Follow teacher directions the first time.
O thers	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Positive feedback only.2. Be kind, be positive.3. Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself.4. Listen when others are speaking.
P roperty	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Use materials for intended use only.2. Take pride in school property and supplies and leave the classroom in better condition than you found it.3. Be prepared with your own materials.4. Only touch your own things.
S elf	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Make positive decisions.2. Be responsible for your actions.3. Stay in dress code.4. Be ready to learn.

Starting the Class	<p>When the bell rings, begin working on your bell work. (Math 7 should log in to question press first, put their laptops under their desks and then begin bell work.)</p>
Classroom Movement (Sharpening pencils, etc.)	<p><u>Prior to the final bell ringing:</u> Pick up your folder, sharpen your pencil, and have all necessary supplies (calculator, paper, graph paper, something to write with, etc.). When the final bell rings: You should be in your seat working on your bell work. You will have approximately 5 minutes to complete bell work each day. You will also need to write down the homework assignment for day if there is one.</p>
Attention Signal	<p>The teacher will count down from 5. When the teacher reaches the number 1, all students should be quiet with eyes on the teacher waiting for additional instructions or information.</p>
Working Independently	<p>Stay on task and work without talking.</p>
Working in Groups	<p>Talk quietly to your group members only. Stay on task. Ask a group member for help first. Then if the whole group needs help, raise your hand.</p>
Asking for Help	<p>Raise your hand and wait to be called upon during class. Attend tutoring when offered. Pick up is at door #6 (South Gym). Also check out the Rose Hul-Man Hotline, Kahn Academy, and other tutoring websites.</p>
Transition Procedures	<p>Quickly put away and get out necessary materials. Be ready to learn when the teacher gives the attention signal.</p>
Obtaining Materials/Supplies	<p>Follow teacher direction for obtaining materials.</p>

Completing & Returning Work	Turn in assignments on time for full credit. If absent, it is the student's responsibility to obtain make-up work and turn it in to the teacher.
Passes (Request to leave the room)	Raise your hand to ask for a pass. You must have your agenda with you with passes in it to use and the pass page must be attached to your agenda. It is up to the teacher to decide whether or not you will be allowed to use a pass. Passes can be given after the first 5 minutes to the last 10 minutes of class.
Ending the Class	Wait for the teacher to dismiss you. The bell does not dismiss you from class. Before you leave for class, make sure you have written down the homework assignment, and gather all of your materials.
