Board of Education Appoints New Superintendent of Schools Associate Superintendent Also Named at Board Meeting

At tonight's public meeting, Perry Township Schools' Board of Education announced Patrick W. Mapes has been appointed as the new Superintendent of Schools, while Chris Sampson has been named the new Associate Superintendent. Both Mr. Mapes' and Mr. Sampson's new roles will begin immediately.

"We believe Mr. Mapes and Mr. Sampson have the diverse expertise needed to serve the needs of our students and meet district goals," said Ed Denning, Board Vice President. "Mr. Mapes' extensive administrative experience, in addition to his collaborative leadership approach, will continue to move our district forward. He is also experienced in the development of technology curriculum for teacher preparation programs. Mr. Mapes began his career as a teacher and basketball coach. He also served as a high school principal and Superintendent of Schools at Delaware Community Schools in Muncie.

"I am honored to have been selected as the new Superintendent," said Mr. Mapes. "As I collaborate with our Board and the Perry community, we will continue to set forth a vision for high-quality education for every student in every school."

Prior to that, he worked as Principal of Monrovia Elementary for 12 years.
