We've had a strong start to the year. This is the first week that students are eligible for the Friday incentive. You should have received a ParentSquare message to inform you if your student was required to come to school today.

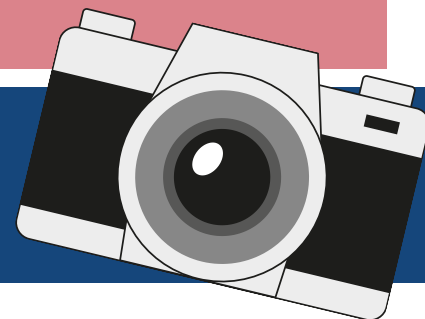
Please continue to encourage your student to attend school each week, attendance is crucial. Please also remind them to complete class work while in class.

Counseling and Social Work

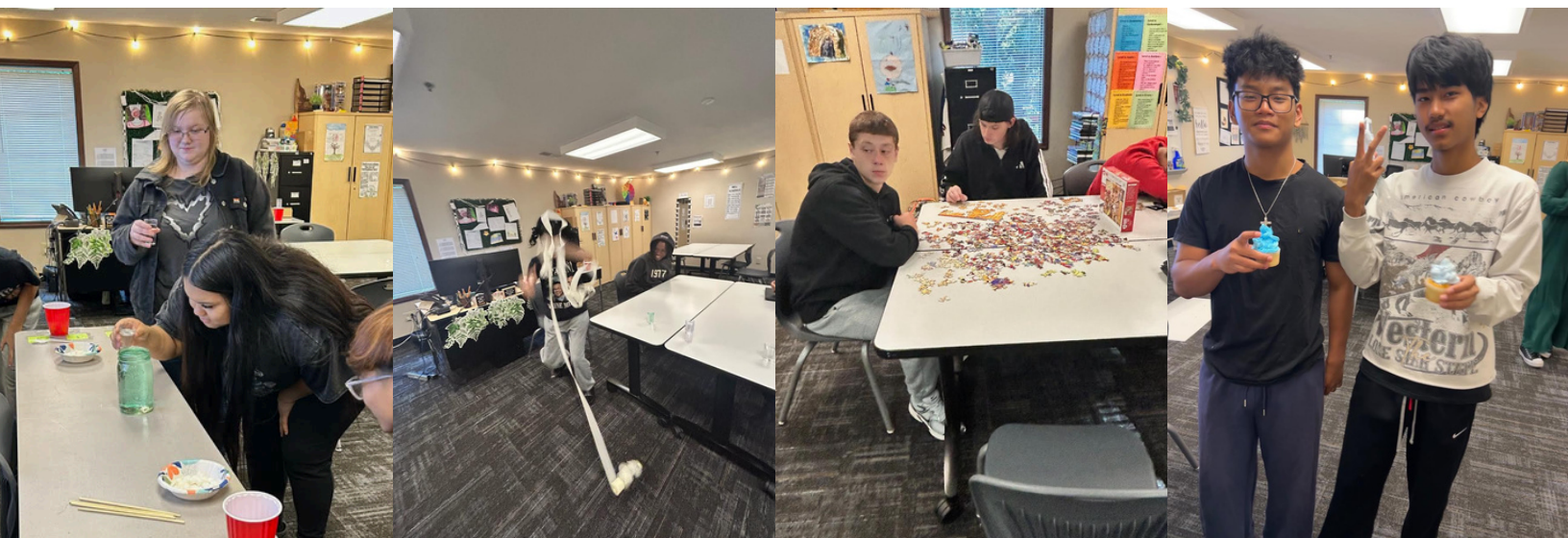
