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Attendance General Info

ATTENDANCE:

- ☐ **7:00am** on campus
- ☐ **7:10am** out of the hallway and in your classroom
- ☐ **Passing periods are 5 minutes long.**
- ☐ Absences need to be reported to the **Attendance Office (317-789-4402 or entered online through SKYWARD)** within 24 hours or they will be marked as unexcused.
- ☐ All appointments will be marked as unexcused until official documentation of the appointment is turned in to the attendance office.

Attendance Interventions

Excused Absences:

- Up to 10 excused absences per school year. After 10 absences parents are required to provide documentation including doctors notes in order for attendance days to be marked as excused.



Unexcused Absences and Behavioral Consequences:

- Excessive period absences may result in disciplinary consequences, course reassignment, or loss of credit.

SEA 482

- Dictates that interventions will take place for students who are chronically absent as defined by law.
- Starting at 5 unexcused absences in any quarter, 10 excused absences for the school year, 15 unexcused absences for the school year, and 20 absences of any kind for the school year, respectively, interventions will start with letters being sent home and proceed from there.

Personal Electronic Device Management

Senate Bill 78: State-enforced "Bell-to-Bell" ban for all personal electronic devices

- Expectations:
- 1.) Powered Off
 - 2.) Stored in lockers or securely put away
 - 3.) Inaccessible from bell-to-bell

- 1st Offense = Warning:** The student may pick up their confiscated device from their designated Team Office at the end of the school day.
- 2nd Offense = Warning:** A parent or guardian must come to the school in person to pick up the device.
- 3rd Offense = 1 Day In-School Suspension:** Parent must pick up the device, and the student will begin receiving progressive consequences.
- 4th Offense = 1 Day Out-of-School Suspension:** Parent must pick up the device. A parent conference is recommended with the parent to eliminate any further incidents.
- 5th Offense = 3 Days of Out-of-School Suspension:** Parent must pick up the device. Parent Conference and an alternative plan will be designed.
- Defiance Notice:** *Refusal to surrender a device when requested by a staff member constitutes defiance and will result in immediate placement in In-School Suspension (ISS) or Out-of-School Suspension (OSS). The device will be immediately confiscated as per ISS rules.*

Note: PMHS is not responsible for lost or stolen personal electronic devices.



HS Dress Code

- **IDs/Lanyards** are a **required** part of the dress code.
 - Lanyard must be worn throughout the school day
 - Loaner Lanyard will be issued if no lanyard
 - Repeated lanyard violation will result in progressive discipline
- Clothing may not be “Unduly revealing”
 - All shorts/skirts must be no higher than mid-thigh
 - No hats, hoodies, or bandanas
 - No midriff tops, tank tops, or plunging necklines
 - Any apparel showing suggestive or profane pictures or wording; showing alcohol, tobacco, or drug-related sayings or pictures; promoting sex, violence or self-destructive behavior; or any item that defames the nation, state, community or an individual is **not permitted**
- Repeated dress code violations will escalate to **“repeated failure to comply”**

Tardies

Period by Period Teacher Reporting

- Students will be allowed 4 “warning” tardies **per class period, per semester**.
- Tardy consequences will be assigned as follows:
 - Tardy 1 - 4:** Record in Skyward + Verbal Warning by teacher
 - Tardy 5:** Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral, Notification to parents through Skyward (auto-generated) + lunch detention assigned by Office
 - Tardy 6:** Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + After School Detention
 - Tardy 7:** Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + Friday School
 - Tardy 8:** Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + Friday School
 - Tardy 9+:** Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral = Team AP issuing progressive discipline (ISS/OSS), Student Staffing w/ parent
