HS Dress Code

Main Office

- **IDs/Lanyards** are a **required** part of the dress code.
 - Loaner lanyard will issued, must return at the end of the day
 - 1st-3rd offense: warning
 - 4th and up progressive discipline applies
- Clothing may not be “Unduly revealing”
 - All shorts/skirts must be no higher than mid-thigh
 - No hats, hoodies, or bandanas
 - No midriff tops, tank tops, or plunging necklines
 - Any apparel showing suggestive or profane pictures or wording; showing alcohol, tobacco, or drug-related sayings or pictures; promoting sex, violence or self-destructive behavior; or any item that defames the nation, state, community or an individual is **not permitted**
- Repeated dress code violations will escalate to **“repeated failure to comply”**

Tardies

Period by Period Teacher Reporting

- Students will be allowed 4 “warning” tardies **per class period, per semester.**
- Tardy consequences will be assigned as follows:

Tardy 1 - 4: Record in Skyward + Verbal Warning by teacher

Tardy 5: Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral, Notification to parents through Skyward (auto-generated) + lunch detention assigned by Office

Tardy 6: Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + After School Detention

Tardy 7: Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + Friday School

Tardy 8: Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral + Friday School

Tardy 9+: Record in Skyward + Teacher creates discipline referral = Team AP issuing progressive discipline (ISS/OSS), Student Staffing w/ parent

Examples of behavior consequences

- Insubordination: missed class time and lunch detention
- Profanity at a staff member: suspension (usually multi days)
- Bullying: reporting, investigating, discipline, parent contact, and remediation
- Nicotine vapes and other tobacco products:
 - 1st offense: ISS, Police warning ticket, Canvas educational course on effects of tobacco products
 - 2nd offense: Suspension, Diversion program letter through Office of Student Services, Police Ticket issued
 - \$25 if the student and parent/guardian attends a one day nicotine vaping diversion course.
 - \$75 if only the student attends.
 - Ticket paid in full if failure to attend.
 - 3+ offenses: 5 days OSS, possible change of placement
- Any illegal offense – suspension pending expulsion hearing (Manifest Determination Conference if needed).

Parking Privileges

How do I get a parking permit

- Must have a driver's license
- Car Registration
- \$10.00
- Park in the far East Lot behind the buses.

You CAN lose your parking privileges

- Poor Attendance
- Excessive Tardies
- Parking in wrong lot
- Grades
- Enforcement starts August 10



Parking Privileges

Consequences for parking in the wrong lot or not having a parking permit

- Warning Notice sticker on side window, car information logged in database
- Parking Ticket \$20.00
- Car will be towed at owners expense if there is a 3rd time.
