Summer 1:1 Device FAQ

Q: Is my student keeping their 1:1 device at home over the summer?

A: Students currently in grades 1-11 will keep their devices at home for next school year. Kindergarten students and Seniors will return their device and power cord to their school.

Q: How should we care for the device over the summer?

A: As during the school year, please ensure the device remains in the case at all times. If not using the device, store the device in case with its power cord.

Q: Can my student use the device over the summer?

A: Yes, students can continue to use the device for summer school and then for additional learning.

Q: Will the device be monitored over the summer?

A: The device will remain filtered as a school device. You will be able to continue seeing your student's activities through Securly.

Q: Who do I contact if the device has an issue over the summer?

A: Contact our Remote Learning staff at remotelearning@perryschools.org.

Q: Who is responsible for the device over the summer?

A: While at home, just as during the school year, families are responsible for safe storage of the device.

Q: We are planning to move over the summer, what do we do?

A: Please have your student return the device on the closing days of school. If you move after school closes, please contact the school front office or remotelearning@perryschools.org to arrange a drop off.

Q: What do we do if we do not want our student to have a device over summer and we do not want to be responsible for it?

A: If your student is attending summer school, they will need to keep the device for that time-period. Contact remotelearning@perryschools.org for drop off information after school usage. Please be aware that your student may be delayed in receiving a device to start the school year if you choose this option.
