


### **Educator Excellence**

### Fun at the State Fair

Perry Meridian High and Southport High scholars were among 200 students who spent time at the Indiana State Fair to learn about careers in agriculture. The visit was part of Lt. Governor Suzanne Crouch's Diversity in Agriculture Day program, which allowed students to learn about the industry and explore different career options.

The students started their day touring several locations around the fairgrounds including the Indiana FFA Pavilion, Normandy Barn, Animal Town, Agriculture/Horticulture building and the Department of Natural Resources building. At each stop, they were met by agricultural representatives, who covered different topics ranging from food production to animal care to entrepreneurship.

Perry Meridian High School is among 14 Indiana schools to receive Special Olympics North America's national banner recognition. The schools are being honored for their efforts to engage students with and without intellectual disabilities in inclusive activities during the 2018-19 school year.

Students experienced the excitement of a professional basketball game, watched themselves on the jumbotron, and rubbed elbows with mascot Freddy Fever!


Our partnership with the Fever allows us to grow students socially, as well as academically.
