More than a Dozen New Additions to the City's COVID-19 Online Resource Guide

INDIANAPOLIS – Last week, Mayor Joe Hogsett announced the launch of a [new tool on the city's Indy.gov website](#) that connects individuals, businesses, and families impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic with community resources. The guide, which simplifies information from a variety of different sources, has already helped thousands of residents connect with food and employment services, along with other programming. Since its launch the site has been updated with more than a dozen new tools, assets, and community supports.

“We continue to see organizations step up for their neighbors during this difficult time. With each new addition to the site, it’s my hope that we can reach more Indianapolis residents and address the unique needs caused by this pandemic,” said Mayor Joe Hogsett.

Since the initial launch, the city has rolled out additional pages, new content, and a [Spanish language version of the resource guide](#). The Office of the Mayor is committed to real-time updates and the further addition of new information throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.
