## **LIGHTS ON FOR JUSTICE**

On Friday, June 19, 2020, the lights at Cardinal Stadium, Falcon Stadium, and other football fields across Marion County will be turned on for 8 minutes 46 seconds. This gesture is a tribute to the late George Floyd. It is also intended to spotlight the need for social justice and an end to racism. The lights will be turned on at 10:14 p.m., which symbolizes Mr. Floyd's birthday, October 14.

June 19 was chosen because of the date's significance to the African American community. Juneteenth, also called Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, or Celebration Day, is an American holiday celebrated on June 19 annually. This date commemorates June 19, 1865 – the emancipation of the last remaining enslaved African Americans.
