Recommended Approval to add the SafeVisitor Module to our current SafeHiring Solutions Contract for Volunteer Background Checks

Ms. Baker recommended approval of the contract with SafeVisitor that will replace the current Raptor contract for volunteer background checks. Safe Visitor is a division of SafeHiring Solutions. The change to Safe Visitor will benefit the following:

Volunteers

- One background check is good for three years
- One background check is suitable for all schools
- If a parent volunteers, there is no need to complete the annual Raptor \$5 check as all background checks are now in one database

Front-office Staff

- Integration with Skyward (our student management system)
- Panic button alert feature
- Fast-pass for high-frequency visitors
- Field trip badges printed in advance

Human Resources

- SafeHiring will facilitate our five-year background checks for all staff and remove the manual data entry as we can now use automated file feeds
- One database for employees, volunteers, and coaches will eliminate emails and phone calls by quickly locating a current background check in one database
- No more delays for parents and schools because we can get immediate customer service with a live representative vs. a chatbot

Recommended Approval of the Landscaping Agreement with Grant Keys Lawn Service to Perform Landscaping at selected Perry Township Schools Buildings.

Mr. Sampson recommended approval of an agreement with Grant Keys Lawn Service to perform landscaping services at selected Perry Township school buildings. The agreement covers bush trimming, mulching and football stadium clean up at Perry Township properties not performed



by PTS staff. Mr. Sampson stated that we solicited quotes for this service and Grant Keys Lawn Service was the low quote. They have expanded their staff and are confident that they can handle the landscaping maintenance along with the lawn maintenance they have contracted with us for. Our previous landscape maintenance company presented a quote representing a 30% increase in pricing. They had served us well in the past but we need to move on from them because of the substantial increase in pricing. Mr. Sampson said that our High Schools, 6th Grade/MS campuses and Holder Field have a dedicated Perry Township Schools Grounds Crew member. Perry Township Schools have moved to a seasonal contract for landscaping maintenance. In the past, our landscape maintenance were calendar year agreements. This agreement spans March 15, 2022 through November 30, 2022 and is for one season.
