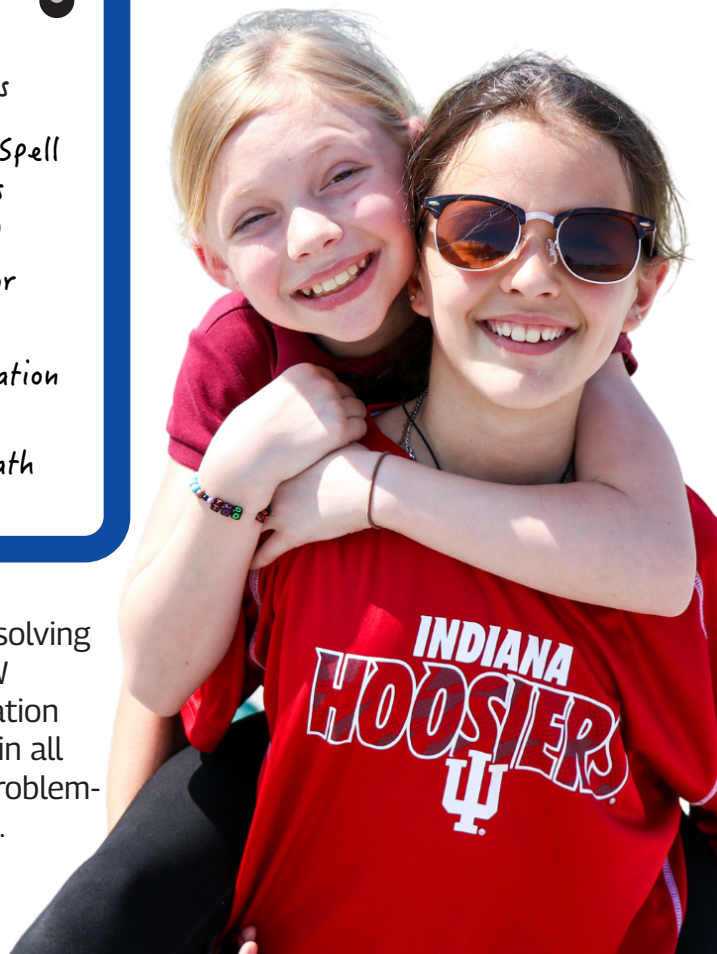

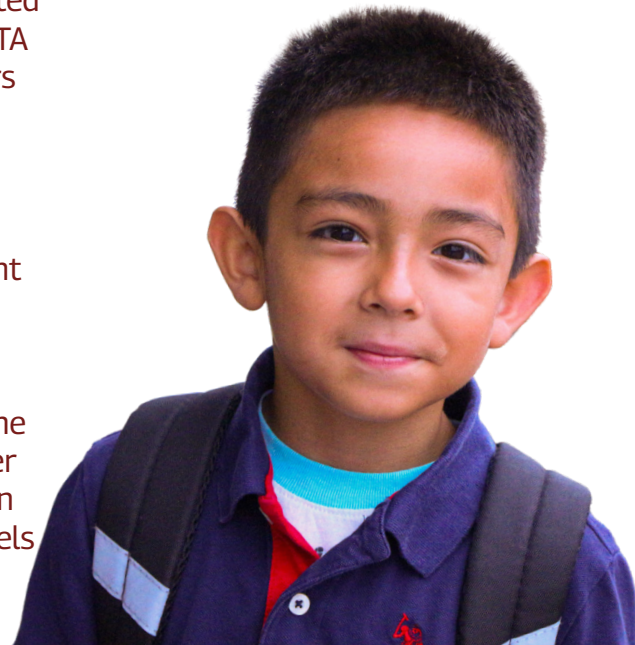

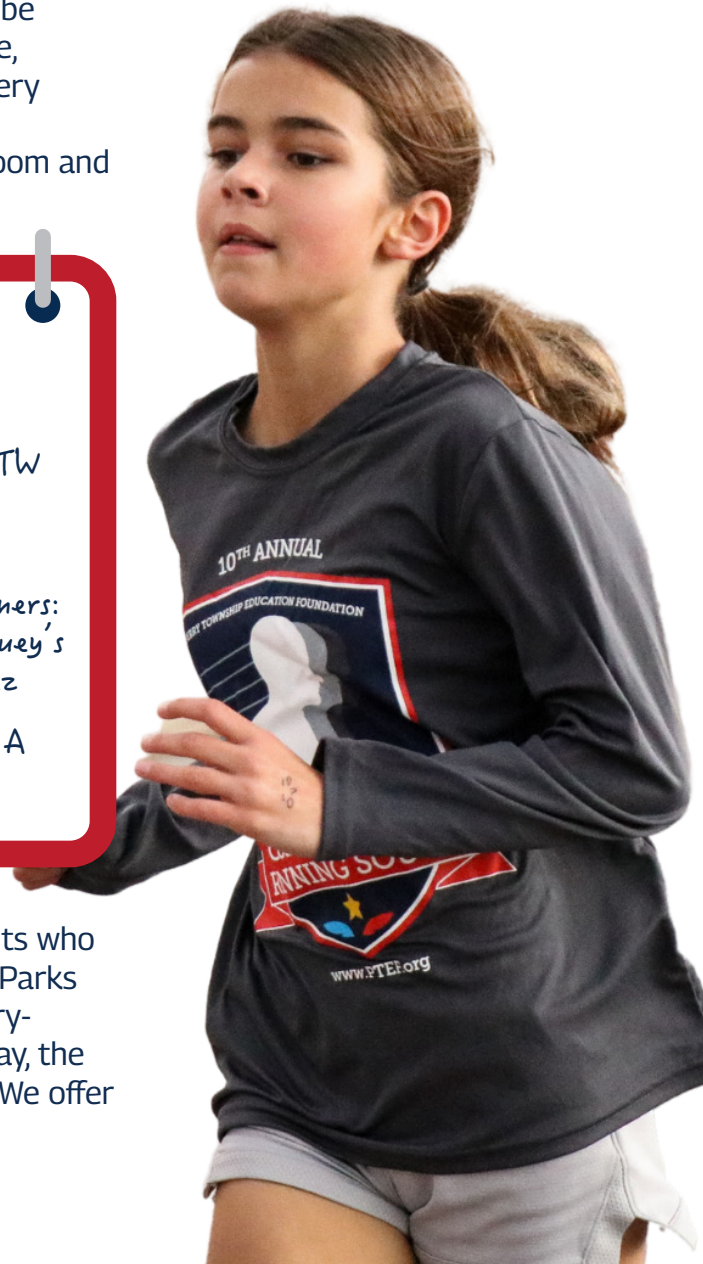
Students subscribe to "The Rocket Way", learning to be respectful, be responsible, and be safe. We have a very purposeful approach to technology in the classroom and
